DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE/AGENDA

Introductory plenary session (on-line, May 6th, h. 9:30 to 11:30)

- Part 1 (9:30-10:15):
The 9th European Research and Innovation Framework Program (Horizon Europe) in pills, the 2024-2027 Strategic Plan and where do we stand. Focus on individual grants: postdoctoral funding opportunities. How to read a call for proposal, how to comply with the funder's requests, with practical examples.
- Coffee break 10:15-10:30
- Part 2 (10:30-11:30, open to everyone but recommended for WS participants):
Overview of the structure of a funding application and of the specificities of individual grant/fellowship proposals: background, objectives, workplan, risk assessment/contingency measures, ethics self-assessment, impact
Other (not least) aspects of proposal assembling: abstract, keywords, evaluation criteria, writing tips and tricks.
Question time.

Writing workshop - 3rd and 4th year PhD Candidates only (in-person, May 15th, h. 9:30-11:30)

- 5 minutes-5 slides research project pitches by WS participants, according to the instructions given in the plenary session (e.g.: project title, objectives, background, workplan, impact/take home message).
WS participants will have to send their slides to the trainer/PhD support staff no later than 24 hours before the WS (instructions will be sent to confirmed enrolled participants). The project idea can relate either to the current PhD thesis work or to a perspective postdoctoral project that the applicant is willing to pursue.
- Work in small groups to convert each 5-slides' talk in a short-written layout and improve the effectiveness/clarity/strength of project description.



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- Sharing of cooperative work results and peer discussion about strengths and weaknesses of the presentations/layouts.
